LET'S TALK TRASH!

Nobody likes it, but we all have it. In a perfect world the second we discarded something it would magically disappear. In our real world, we must wait until Tuesday or Friday morning for trash pickup, and Wednesday for recycling. This means each resident is responsible for his or her own mess until the moment it is removed by the Sanitation Workers.

That mega windstorm of early January resulted in an enormous amount of trash blowing around our Road. It should serve as a reminder to us all to be diligent about securing our trash when we put it out and to accept responsibility for each scrap of it until it is safely carted away by the truck.

Here are several hints for making your trash secure, so that it – and your trash containers – won't end up littering the street and/or your neighbors' driveways:

- 1. **Don't rely** on plastic bags. Crows, rats and other small, hungry animals will usually tear them open and make a mess.
- 2. **Make sure** your trashcan lids are secure, both animal-and-windproof.
- 3. If it's a windy day, or you know ahead of time that it's going to be windy, wait till as close to pickup time as you can before putting your trash out for collection. (continued over)

Help is Available

For starters, if you need any special services like removing oversized items (appliances, beds, etc.) or getting rid of large amounts tree cuttings/garden waste, please call 800.773.2784 and just ask. The folks at our Sanitation Department are VERY helpful.

With regard to recycling, rumor has it that Malibu Road is a champion in this department... good for us! But in case any of us need a refresher in what they'll take and how they want it, here goes:

<u>Do recycle</u> ALL paper except paper towels and tissues. All glass, tin, aluminum, cardboard, untreated wood, and most plastics.

<u>Do not</u> recycle Styrofoam.

<u>Do not</u> put your recycling in plastic bags.

And here's the best part: if you would like to have a "green" or "household" recycling bin delivered to your house, *free of charge*, please call 800.773.2784 and ask for one...It's as easy as that! We **can** keep Malibu Road looking tidy with just a little effort from everyone.
